The bill creates the potential of having to verify and validate 5 years of State and local, use, excise, property and governmental taxes; the number of buildings owned/leased and substantially occupied as a principle place of business; number persons employed or contracted; and the amount of goods produced in the State or supplied by a dealer on potentially 1,480 persons. The verification and validation process will require the addition of staff and will create a delay in the awarding of needed services and good to the using State agencies.
