BDR 43 - 13 increases the maximum speed at which a person may drive or operate a vehicle from 75 miles per hour to 85 miles per hour, subject to some limitations. Enforcing Nevada laws relating to roads are a primary duty of the Nevada Highway patrol. A violation of this nature is already a primary offense that the officers of the Nevada Highway Patrol would issue a citation. Patrolling roadways at a higher rate of speed could have an impact on the fuel economy of the vehicle which could result in higher fuel costs as well as an increase in vehicle wear and tear. The actual fiscal impact cannot be determined.
