The Department of Corrections has reviewed AB 40/BDR 41-353 which proposes to incorporate new provisions into Chapter 468 of the Nevada Revised Statutes by making unlawful to 1) receive compensation, reward, or a share of the assets earned from bets or wagers administered by non-licensed establishments; 2) to accept or facilitate bets or wagers made on behalf of another person without paying the applicable taxes; and 3) to transfer any assets or proceeds realized from illegal gambling activity. If the proposed law is enacted, it will be a category B felony to engage in any activities of the proposed law resulting in a penalty of 1 to 6 years in a state prison.

NDOC research staff searched for offenders charged with commission of illegal gambling activities, and noted that, as of January of 2015, there were only five offenders in custody who were convicted of A to C felonies. The NDOC hasn't come across sufficient investigative data to determine if the gambling activities mentioned in the proposed law could cause a significant impact on the prison population in the upcoming biennia. Thus, the NDOC assumes that enactment of the law should have no substantial significance on prison growth.
