BDR 14-559 allows the State Controller to collect fines, administrative assessments, fees, and/or restitution. Currently, Parole and Probation collects supervision fees, psychosexual evaluation reimbursements (fees), and DNA test reimbursements (fees) and that revenue helps fund expenditures in Parole and Probation's budget. If the State Controller collects and retains the supervision, DNA, and psychosexual evaluation fees, the lost revenue in Parole and Probation's budget will need to be backfilled with General Fund in order to keep Parole and Probation's budget whole.
