Comment: This BDR would allow for electronic transmission of all voter registration information from the DMV. A very high percentage of voter registration applications are accepted by the DMV for Washoe County(possibly as high as 70%).

Section 14 of the bill requires that voter notification cards be mailed to the voter within two business days. This requirement put stress on our current system. Our Repographics Department prints and mails these card for the Registrar of Voters. We currently only run this process weekly. The provisions in the bill that allow e-mail notification will complicate the process by requiring a email be sent first. Impact will be minimal but cannot be determined.
