Comment: The language of the bill in confusing because it says that \$10,000,000 is appropriated, but then each district is limited to \$120,000. With only 17 districts in the state, it would seem there would be quite a bit of money left available with no way to distribute it.

As far as impact, the \$120,000 would pay for one teacher, one paraprofessional, and some supplies, for one classroom. We would have a problem finding space as all of our elementary schools are full and 3 are using modular classrooms. If we only received the \$3,200 per student, for a classroom of 20 students, we could not even afford the average compensation for one of our teachers.

The impact I list assumes we would receive the \$120,000 and had an open classroom.

Comment: Funding from this BDR would not supplant (replace) existing funding, since Douglas County School District has two Early Childhood Education programs that will sunset due to expiring federal grant funding (Striving Reader) in June 2016. The district has 80 students total across 2 schools (20 3-yr olds and 20 4-yr olds). Each program is staffed by a fully credentialed ECE teacher and highly qualified 6.5 hour/day aide and provides instructional services and supports to 40 students (20 morning and 20 afternoon) each day. \$3,200 per student (or a max of \$120,000) would be about enough to fund one preschool of 40 students (20 morning, 20 afternoon). Existing materials and supplies would be used to operate the ECE program(s) – no additional major expenses would be needed.

All items regarding: the development of a comprehensive plan for the provision of early childhood services; identification of need based on readiness for kindergarten; promotion of the ECE program within the community; and providing longitudinal performance, outcome, and impact data will be accomplished using existing district resources.

As long as funding per allocation (ECE) is approximately \$120,000 there will be minimal cost impact upon the district, unless there are requirements to subscribe on a regular basis to any non-existing specialized tools, resources, or assessments (at this point not determined).
