**A.B. 396 / BDR 39 - 820**

City/County: <b>Churchill County</b> Approved by: Eleanor Lockwood, County Manager Comment: Bill 39-820 requires the County to pay for the examination and treatment of certain uninsured persons who may need mental health assistance. Furthermore, if the patient is indigent, the County would be responsible for the treatment cost associated with their illness. The financial burden could be significant depending on the number of qualified individuals and the required treatment necessary. On average an evaluation is \$1,000.

City/County: <b>Clark County</b> Approved by: David Dobrzynski, Assistant Director of Finance Comment: Fiscal impact unknown but might be significant. Section 6 of the bill proposes both a second opinion and primary opinion by a doctor not affiliated with mental institution. Existing law requires the County to pay for the primary opinion only for indigent persons which is rendered by doctor affiliated with the mental institution. Because there are no existing data to use, estimating the fiscal impact is unknown.

The Public Administrator/DA would have costs associated with this.

Comment: There is a fiscal impact to this proposed change that cannot be determined with any level of accuracy, as the potential population presenting under the conditions described for an undetermined level of medical evaluation, subsequent hospitalization and or treatment is unknown.

The proposed changes would result in costs for medical evaluations and procedures, treatment and hospitalization that would be anticipated to be paid by the County government, offset by eligible Medicaid, Medicare or private insurance reimbursements.
