BDR 43-13 Increases the 75 MPH maximum speed (up to 85 MPH) at which a person may drive or operate a vehicle. Determining areas of Nevada highways at which maximum speed limits could be raised without significant risk of endangering public safety requires engineering study of speeds actually driven, adequacy of sight distance, geometry of the roadway (curves and slopes), and other factors prescribed by the Federal Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) as well as crash data analysis and coordination with NHP and local authorities. These studies can be performed by existing NDOT staff. Costs of staff travel and per diem would be incurred. Signs would need to be replaced where necessary. All of these tasks can be accomplished without additional expenditure authority.
