## Marc Johnson (President, University of Nevada, Reno):

We are here to support  $\underline{S.B.~339}$ . I have written testimony explaining the need for this (Exhibit C).

This bill adds the Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE) institutions and property to the list of entities that can impose further controls on the use and sale of tobacco products on its grounds. This is one of several measures we are implementing to put the emphasis on human capital development, physical as well as intellectual, on the part of our students. It is important for a medical school that conducts social and behavioral health research to implement behaviors that are consistent with the research that comes out of the institution.

The Board of Regents of NSHE supports this move. At the University of Nevada, Reno, we have had strong endorsement through surveys and resolutions on the part of our student senate (<u>Exhibit D</u>), the faculty senate and the staff employees' council. There is strong support across the campus to move to a tobacco-free environment, and this bill will allow us to do so.

We know from research that people who smoke before the age of 20 years tend not to be lifetime smokers. Those who are still smoking when they reach 20 years tend to smoke all their lives. A tobacco-free campus will provide an environment that discourages people from becoming lifelong smokers. This increases productivity and decreases health costs for those individuals and society as a whole.
