SUMMARY—Authorizes the creation of community education advisory boards. (BDR 34-457)

AN ACT relating to education; authorizing the creation of a community education advisory board by certain local governmental entities to provide input, advice and assistance to the board of trustees of a school district on issues relating to public education; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

#### **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

This bill authorizes the creation of a community education advisory board by the governing body of a city or a board of county commissioners to facilitate broad community input and provide advice and assistance to the board of trustees of a school district on issues relating to public education. The members of a community education advisory board may include, without limitation, the parents or legal guardians of pupils enrolled in schools within the city or county, pupils, principals, teachers or other licensed educational personnel, support staff, officers or employees of a local government or any other person, agency or organization within the city or county that has a role in public education. This bill specifies that a community education advisory board, if created, must adopt rules for its organization and any other necessary procedural rules. This bill also requires the board of trustees of a school district to include a separate item on the agenda of each regularly scheduled meeting of the board of trustees to allow the community education advisory board to provide input, advice and assistance to the board of trustees concerning such issues relating to public education as designated by the community education advisory board.

# THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Chapter 386 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. To facilitate broad community input on issues relating to public education and to provide advice and assistance to the board of trustees of a school district, one or more community education advisory boards may be created by:
- (a) The governing body of a city in which one or more public schools are located; or
- (b) The board of county commissioners of a county for any area in a county in which a public school is located and which is not a city.
- 2. The members of a community education advisory board may include, without limitation:
- (a) A member of the board of trustees of the school district which represents the city or county, as applicable, in which the community education advisory board is located;
- (b) Parents or legal guardians of pupils enrolled in public schools within the city or county, as applicable;
- (c) Pupils enrolled in public schools within the city or county, as applicable;
- (d) Principals, teachers or other licensed educational personnel employed at public schools within the city or county, as applicable;
- (e) Support staff employed at public schools within the city or county, as applicable;
- (f) Officers or employees of a local government, as applicable; and
- (g) Any other person, agency or organization which has a role in public education within the city or county, as applicable.
- 3. Each community education advisory board shall establish rules for its organization and such procedural rules as are necessary, including, without limitation:
  - (a) The number of members who may be selected to serve;
  - (b) The term of each member;
    - (c) Which members are entitled to vote;
    - (d) The manner in which to call meetings; and
- (e) Any other rules necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.
- 4. Once a community education advisory board is established, the board of trustees of a school district shall include an item on the agenda of each regularly scheduled meeting of the board of trustees that is separate from any other item to allow the
