ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 392–ASSEMBLYMEN OSCARSON; ELLISON AND WHEELER

SUMMARY—Revises provisions concerning certain communications relating to elections. (BDR 23-85)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in **bolded italics** is new; matter between brackets formitted material is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to elections; prohibiting a public officer or employee from using official stationery for certain purposes relating to elections; requiring a disclosure on certain elections-related communications; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law prohibits a public officer or employee from using governmental time, property, equipment or other facility to benefit a significant personal or pecuniary interest of the public officer or employee, unless certain exceptions apply. (NRS 281A.400) Existing law also prohibits a public officer or employee from requesting or otherwise causing a governmental entity to incur an expense or make an expenditure to support or oppose a ballot question or candidate. (NRS 281A.520) Section 1 of this bill expressly prohibits a public officer or employee from using official stationery from a state or local governmental entity to express support for or opposition to a candidate, committee for political action, political party, committee sponsored by a political party or ballot question or to solicit a contribution or a commitment to make a contribution for any political purpose. If a communication that is published in support of or in opposition to a candidate includes the name and address of a governmental entity, section 2 of this bill requires that the communication disclose in a clear and conspicuous manner that the communication was not published by the governmental entity.



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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 281A of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. A public officer or employee shall not use official stationery to:
- (a) Express support for or opposition to a candidate or group of candidates, committee for political action, political party, committee sponsored by a political party or ballot question; or
- (b) Solicit a contribution or a commitment to make such a contribution for any political purpose.
 - 2. As used in this section:

- 11 (a) "Candidate" has the meaning ascribed to it in 12 NRS 294A.005.
 - (b) "Committee for political action" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 294A.0055.
- 15 (c) "Committee sponsored by a political party" has the 16 meaning ascribed to it in NRS 294A.0065.
 - (d) "Contribution" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 294A.007.
 - (e) "Official stationery" means stationery that contains any symbol, name, word or mark of a state or local governmental entity, including, without limitation, the Great Seal of the State of Nevada.
 - **Sec. 2.** Chapter 294A of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
 - 1. If a communication that is published in support of or in opposition to a candidate includes the name and address of a governmental entity, the communication must disclose in a clear and conspicuous manner that the communication was not published by the governmental entity.
 - 2. As used in this section:
 - (a) "Governmental entity" means an institution, board, commission, bureau, council, department, division, authority or other unit of government of this State, including, without limitation, an agency of this State or of a political subdivision.
 - (b) "Publish" means the act of:
 - (1) Printing, posting, broadcasting, mailing or otherwise disseminating; or
 - (2) Causing to be printed, posted, broadcasted, mailed or otherwise disseminated.

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
