AN ACT making a supplemental appropriation to the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department of Health and Human Services for a projected shortfall resulting from an increase in the Medicaid caseload over the amount legislatively approved for Fiscal Years 2015-2016 and 2016-2017; authorizing the expenditure of certain money for the same purposes; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of \$5,800,224 for a projected shortfall resulting from an increase in the Medicaid caseload over the amount legislatively approved for Fiscal Years 2015-2016 and 2016-2017. Sec. 2. Expenditure of \$124,074,692 not appropriated from the State General Fund or the State Highway Fund is hereby authorized during the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2016, and ending on June 30, 2017, by the Division for the same purposes as set forth as section 1 of this act. This authorization is supplemental to that made by section 1 of chapter 484, Statutes of Nevada 2015, at page 2854. **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
