ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION—Urging Congress to abolish the Gold Butte National Monument.

WHEREAS, On December 28, 2016, former President of the United States Barack H. Obama signed a presidential proclamation establishing the Gold Butte National Monument; and

WHEREAS, The area encompassed within the Gold Butte National Monument consists of approximately 296,937 acres, of which approximately 285,158 acres are managed by the Secretary of the Interior through the Bureau of Land Management and approximately 11,779 acres are managed by the Secretary through the Bureau of Reclamation; and

WHEREAS, The Gold Butte National Monument covers a significant portion of southeastern Nevada; and

WHEREAS, The presidential proclamation establishing the Gold Butte National Monument appropriated and withdrew the federal lands located within the Gold Butte National Monument from all forms of entry, location, patent, selection, sale or other disposition under various federal public land laws, mining laws and laws relating to mineral and geothermal leasing; and

WHEREAS, The appropriation and withdrawal of the federal lands located within the Gold Butte National Monument will severely curtail commercial, noncommercial and recreational

activities in southeastern Nevada, thereby affecting the economy and growth of the population of this State; and

WHEREAS, Gold Butte National Monument was established unilaterally without consulting any state or local government and without concern for the residents of this State; and

WHEREAS, To ensure a publicly supported and transparent process for presidential actions, the establishment of the Gold Butte National Monument should have included input from interest groups, local communities and elected representatives in this State; and

WHEREAS, During a period of 2 years, former President of the United States Barack H. Obama signed executive orders and proclamations which placed restrictions on approximately 1 million acres of land in this State, which is an area larger than the entire State of Rhode Island; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY AND SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, JOINTLY, That the members of the 79th Session of the Nevada Legislature hereby urge Congress to overturn the presidential proclamation establishing the Gold Butte National Monument and to take any other actions necessary to ensure the abolishment of the designation of the Gold Butte National Monument; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Chief Clerk of the Assembly prepare and transmit a copy of this resolution to the President of the United States, the Vice President of the United States as the presiding officer of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives and each member of the Nevada Congressional Delegation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this resolution becomes effective upon passage.
