SUMMARY—Establishes Public Lands Day in the State of Nevada.
(BDR 19-770)

AN ACT relating to public lands; establishing the ~~fourth~~ last Saturday in September of each year as “Public Lands Day” in the State of Nevada; authorizing the Governor to issue annually a proclamation encouraging the observance of Public Lands Day; requiring the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to allow residents of this State to enter, camp and boat in all state parks and recreational areas in this State without the payment of any fees during Public Lands Day; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

1 **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

2 Under existing law, various days and weeks of observance are recognized in this State.
3 (NRS 236.018-236.085) **Section 1** of this bill establishes the ~~fourth~~ last Saturday in
4 September of each year as “Public Lands Day” in the State of Nevada and authorizes the
5 Governor to issue annually a proclamation encouraging the observance of Public Lands Day.

6 Existing law requires the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation
7 and Natural Resources to impose and collect, subject to approval by the Director of the
8 Department, reasonable fees for entering, camping and boating in state parks and recreational
9 areas in this State. (NRS 407.065) **Section 2** of this bill requires the Division to allow
10 residents of this State to enter, camp and boat in all state parks and recreational areas in this
11 State without the payment of any fees during Public Lands Day. **Section 2** also provides that
12 the free day of camping must include either the Friday night before Public Lands Day or
13 overnight on the night of Public Lands Day, as determined by the Administrator of the
Division for each state park and recreational area.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 236 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
2 section to read as follows:

3 *1. The fourth last Saturday in September of each year is established as
4 "Public Lands Day" in the State of Nevada.*

5 *2. The Governor may issue annually a proclamation encouraging the
6 observance of Public Lands Day. The proclamation may, without limitation:*

7 *(a) Call upon the news media, state and local officers, private nonprofit
8 groups and foundations, schools, businesses and other public and private entities
9 to bring to the attention of the residents of this State the importance of public
10 lands in the State of Nevada; and*

11 *(b) Recognize the economic, scenic and other value of public lands in this
12 State.*

13 **Sec. 2.** NRS 407.065 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 407.065 1. The Administrator, subject to the approval of the Director:

15 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph and NRS 407.066, may
16 establish, name, plan, operate, control, protect, develop and maintain state parks,
17 monuments and recreational areas for the use of the general public. The name of an
18 existing state park, monument or recreational area may not be changed unless the
19 Legislature approves the change by statute.

20 (b) Shall protect state parks and property controlled or administered by the
21 Division from misuse or damage and preserve the peace within those areas. The
22 Administrator may appoint or designate certain employees of the Division to have
23 the general authority of peace officers.

24 (c) May allow multiple use of state parks and real property controlled or
25 administered by the Division for any lawful purpose, including, but not limited to,
26 grazing, mining, development of natural resources, hunting and fishing, in
27 accordance with such regulations as may be adopted in furtherance of the purposes
28 of the Division.

29 (d) Except as otherwise provided in this ~~paragraph,~~ section, shall impose and
30 collect reasonable fees for entering, camping and boating in state parks and
31 recreational areas. The Division shall issue an annual permit for entering, camping
32 and boating in all state parks and recreational areas in this State:

33 (1) Upon application therefor and proof of residency and age, to any
34 person who is 65 years of age or older and has resided in this State for at least 5
35 years immediately preceding the date on which the application is submitted.

36 (2) Upon application therefor and proof of residency and proof of status as
37 described in subsection 5 of NRS 361.091, to a bona fide resident of the State of
38 Nevada who has incurred a permanent service-connected disability of 10 percent or
39 more and has been honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United
40 States.

41 → The permit must be issued without charge, except that the Division shall charge
42 and collect an administrative fee for the issuance of the permit in an amount
43 sufficient to cover the costs of issuing the permit.

44 (e) May conduct and operate such special services as may be necessary for the
45 comfort and convenience of the general public, and impose and collect reasonable
46 fees for such special services.

47 (f) May rent or lease concessions located within the boundaries of state parks
48 or of real property controlled or administered by the Division to public or private
49 corporations, to groups of natural persons, or to natural persons for a valuable

1 consideration upon such terms and conditions as the Division deems fit and proper,
2 but no concessionaire may dominate any state park operation.

3 (g) May establish such capital projects construction funds as are necessary to
4 account for the parks improvements program approved by the Legislature. The
5 money in these funds must be used for the construction and improvement of those
6 parks which are under the supervision of the Administrator.

7 (h) In addition to any concession specified in paragraph (f), may establish
8 concessions within the boundaries of any state park to provide for the sale of food,
9 drinks, ice, publications, sundries, gifts and souvenirs, and other such related items
10 as the Administrator determines are appropriately made available to visitors. Any
11 money received by the Administrator for a concession established pursuant to this
12 paragraph must be deposited in the Account for State Park Interpretative and
13 Educational Programs and Operation of Concessions created by NRS 407.0755.

14 2. The Administrator:

15 (a) Shall issue an annual permit to a person who pays a reasonable fee as
16 prescribed by regulation which authorizes the holder of the permit to enter each
17 state park and each recreational area in this State and, except as otherwise provided
18 in subsection 3, use the facilities of the state park or recreational area without
19 paying the entrance fee; and

20 (b) May issue an annual permit to a person who pays a reasonable fee as
21 prescribed by regulation which authorizes the holder of the permit to enter a
22 specific state park or specific recreational area in this State and, except as otherwise
23 provided in subsection 3, use the facilities of the state park or recreational area
24 without paying the entrance fee.

25 3. An annual permit issued pursuant to subsection 2 does not authorize the
26 holder of the permit to engage in camping or boating, or to attend special events.
27 The holder of such a permit who wishes to engage in camping or boating, or to
28 attend special events, must pay any fee established for the respective activity.

29 4. *During each Public Lands Day observed pursuant to section 1 of this act,
30 and upon proof of residency in this State, the Division shall allow a resident of
31 this State to enter, camp and boat in any state park or recreational area without
32 the payment of any fees for those activities. The free day of camping authorized
33 pursuant to this subsection must include either the Friday night before Public
34 Lands Day or overnight on the night of Public Lands Day, as determined by the
35 Administrator for each state park and recreational area. A person is not entitled
36 to receive more than one free night of camping during each Public Lands Day
37 pursuant to this subsection.*

38 5. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 1 of NRS 407.0762 and
39 subsection 1 of NRS 407.0765, the fees collected pursuant to paragraphs (d), (e)
40 and (f) of subsection 1 or subsection 2 must be deposited in the State General Fund.

41 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2017.
