SENATE BILL NO. 108—COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

(ON BEHALF OF THE NEVADA YOUTH LEGISLATURE)

PREFILED FEBRUARY 8, 2017

Referred to Committee on Education

SUMMARY—Requires a study to determine the manner in which to include certain instruction relating to criminal law in the social studies curriculum for public high schools. (BDR S-523)

AN ACT relating to education; requiring the State Board of Education to create a subcommittee to study the manner in which to include certain instruction in criminal law in the social studies courses required for graduation from a public high school; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires each pupil enrolled in a public high school to enroll in at least three units of credit in social studies. (NRS 389.018) This bill requires the State Board of Education to create a subcommittee to study the manner in which to include certain instruction in criminal law in the required units of credit in social studies and specifies certain crimes which frequently involve persons under the age of 18 years that must be included in the instruction. In addition, this bill requires that such instruction emphasize personal responsibility for understanding and complying with the law and lists specific topics to be included as part of this instruction. In addition, the instruction must include information to assist victims and witnesses of such crimes and lists specific topics for this instruction. This bill requires: (1) the State Board of Education to report the findings of the subcommittee to the Legislative Committee on Education, including any actions it has taken or intends to take to include the instruction in the social studies courses; and (2) the Legislative Committee on Education to consider the report and transmit any recommendations for legislation to ensure the instruction is included in the curriculum for social studies to the 80th Session of the Nevada Legislature.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. (Deleted by amendment.)

Sec. 1.5. 1. The State Board of Education shall create a subcommittee to study the manner in which to include, in one of the three units of credit in social

1 studies required pursuant to NRS 389.018 instruction concerning crimes that
2 frequently involve persons under the age of 18 years. Such instruction must include,
3 without limitation, crimes involving:

4 (a) Sexual conduct, including, without limitation, sexual assault, statutory
5 sexual seduction, sex trafficking and sexting;

6 (b) Alcohol and controlled substances, including, without limitation, driving
7 under the influence and the possession, use and distribution of alcohol and
8 controlled substances;

9 (c) Domestic violence;

10 (d) Stalking; and

11 (e) Destruction of property.

12 2. The instruction described in subsection 1 must emphasize personal
13 responsibility for understanding and complying with the law and must include,
14 without limitation, instruction on:

15 (a) The elements of the various crimes;

16 (b) Appropriate conduct necessary to avoid being accused of such crimes,
17 including, without limitation, specific instruction concerning the legal requirements
18 for finding consent with respect to sexual conduct;

19 (c) The consequences of engaging in such crimes;

20 (d) The rights of a person alleged to have committed any such crime; and

21 (e) The criminal justice system.

22 3. The instruction described in subsection 1 must provide information to
23 assist victims and witnesses of such crimes, including, without limitation:

24 (a) The rights of victims;

25 (b) Resources available to victims;

26 (c) The rights and responsibilities of a person who witnesses any such crime;
27 and

28 (d) Information concerning how to report such a crime and where to seek
29 assistance.

30 4. The study conducted by the subcommittee created pursuant to subsection 1
31 must include, without limitation:

32 (a) The manner in which to modify the curriculum of the relevant course in
33 social studies to include the instruction described in subsections 1, 2 and 3;

34 (b) Any appropriate revision to the requirements for licensure or endorsement
35 that may be necessary or appropriate for a teacher who provides the instruction
36 described in subsections 1, 2 and 3;

37 (c) The professional development that may be necessary or appropriate for a
38 teacher who provides the instruction described in subsections 1, 2 and 3; and

39 (d) Consideration of any similar instruction provided in another state or school
40 district.

41 5. The subcommittee created pursuant to subsection 1 shall report its findings
42 to the State Board of Education on or before April 1, 2018. The State Board of
43 Education shall, on or before July 1, 2018, submit a report to the Legislative
44 Committee on Education which includes its recommendations to carry out the
45 instruction described in subsections 1, 2 and 3, as well as any actions the State
46 Board has taken or intends to take to include the instruction in the relevant social
47 studies course.

48 6. The Legislative Committee on Education shall consider the report
49 submitted by the State Board of Education and, on or before September 1, 2018,
50 prepare and submit a written report to the Director of the Legislative Counsel
51 Bureau, for transmittal to the 80th Session of the Nevada Legislature, concerning
52 the Committee's consideration of the matters described in this section and any
53 recommendations for legislation to ensure the instruction described in subsections

1 1, 2 and 3 are included in the curriculum for social studies that is required to be
2 taken in high school.

3 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2017.
