SUMMARY—Makes an appropriation for the creation and maintenance of school gardens. (BDR S-834)

AN ACT making an appropriation for the creation and maintenance of school gardens for certain Title I schools; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

- 1 Assembly Bill No. 337 of the 77th Session of the Nevada Legislature was adopted in
2 order to strongly encourage each school to establish and participate in programs, including a
3 school garden program, in order to promote the consumption of fresh fruits and vegetables by
4 children.
5 This bill appropriates money to provide for the creation and maintenance of programs that
6 provide school gardens for Title I schools.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
2 the State Department of Agriculture for the cost of creating and maintaining
3 programs for school gardens that meet the requirements of subsection 2:
4 For the Fiscal Year 2017-2018..... \$410,000
5 For the Fiscal Year 2018-2019..... \$205,000
6 2. Subject to the limitations of subsection ~~4-1~~ 6, the Department shall allocate
7 the money appropriated by subsection 1 to schools which meet the requirements of
8 subsection 3 to provide at the school a program for a school garden which meets the
9 requirements set forth in subsection 4.
10 3. For a school to receive an allocation of money pursuant to subsection 2, the
11 school must be a Title I school as defined in NRS 385A.040.

1 4. For a school to receive an allocation of money to provide a program for a
2 school garden pursuant to subsection 2, the program must:

3 (a) Create and maintain a school garden at the school. ~~†~~

4 (b) Have a curriculum that:

5 (1) Is tailored to pupils of the appropriate grade levels at the school;

6 (2) Is written specifically for Nevada and the desert environment of
7 Nevada;

8 (3) ~~Includes projects that are related to courses of study in the subjects of~~

9 Complies with the standards of content and performance for a course of study
10 in science adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant to NRS 389.520;

11 (4) Uses experiential learning or project-based learning to teach
12 science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics;

13 ~~††~~ (5) Is designed with the assistance of teachers and other educational
14 personnel with experience at the appropriate grade levels at the school; and

15 ~~††~~ (6) Involves ~~classroom and tactile~~ supervised learning experiences
16 for the pupils at the school. ~~†~~ in a classroom and an outdoor garden.

17 (c) Provide the school with assistance from members of the community,
18 including, without limitation, trained educators, local farmers and local chefs. ~~†~~
19 ~~and~~

20 (d) Provide pupils with the:

21 (1) Ability to operate a farmer's market to sell the produce from the school
22 garden; and

23 (2) Opportunity to have a local chef or employee of a school who works
24 in food services demonstrate how to cook a meal using the produce grown from the
25 school garden.

26 (e) Establish garden teams comprised of teachers and, if such persons are
27 available, parents and members of the community. Each garden team shall
28 meet at least once each month.

29 (f) Require any local nonprofit or community-based organization which
30 will provide services to implement the program for a school garden to have at
31 least 2 years of experience implementing such a program.

32 5. Money allocated pursuant to subsection 2 may be used by a school to:

33 (a) Provide professional development for teachers regarding the:

34 (1) Use of a school garden to teach pupils with disabilities;

35 (2) Development and implementation of science, technology,
36 engineering, arts and mathematics curricula that incorporate the use of a
37 school garden; and

38 (3) Development and implementation of a food safety plan designed to
39 ensure that food grown in a school garden is properly handled and safe to sell
40 and consume;

41 (b) Pay for any travel expenses associated with the attendance of a teacher
42 at any training or conference relating to school gardens; and

43 (c) Pay for the costs of a conference regarding school gardens held in this
44 State.

45 6. Pursuant to subsection 2, a school may receive an allocation of not more
46 than \$10,000 for the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 and not more than \$5,000 for the Fiscal
47 Year 2018-2019.

48 ~~†~~ 7. Any balance of the sums appropriated by subsection 1 remaining at the
49 end of the respective fiscal years must not be committed for expenditure after June
50 30 of the respective fiscal years by the entity to which the appropriation is made or
51 any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise
52 transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining
53 must not be spent for any purpose after September 21, 2018, and September 20,

1 2019, respectively, by either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the
2 entity to which the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be
3 reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 21, 2018, and September
4 20, 2019, respectively.

5 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2017.
