SUMMARY—Requires certain pharmacies to post or provide a means for persons to dispose written instructions for the safe disposal of unused drugs. (BDR 54-634)

AN ACT relating to pharmacies; requiring certain pharmacies in this State to post or provide a means for persons to dispose written instructions for the safe disposal of unused drugs; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

1 **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

2 Existing law provides, in certain institutional settings, for the return of certain unused
3 drugs to the dispensing pharmacy and the reissue or transfer of such drugs. (NRS 433.801,
4 435.700, 449.2485, 639.2675, 639.2676) Existing law also establishes programs for the
5 donation, distribution and dispensing of drugs to treat HIV/AIDS and cancer. (Chapter 453B
6 of NRS) This bill requires each retail community pharmacy in this State to post in a
7 conspicuous place on the premises of the pharmacy or provide a means for persons to dispose
upon request, written instructions for safely dispose disposing of unused drugs.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Chapter 639 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
2 section to read as follows:

3 1. Each retail community pharmacy in this State shall post in a conspicuous
4 place on the premises of the pharmacy or provide a means for persons to
5 dispose, upon the request of any person, written instructions concerning the
6 safe disposal of unused drugs, including, without limitation, opioids and other
7 drugs that were not dispensed by the retail community pharmacy. Such means
8 may include, without limitation:
9 (a) Offering, for sale or free of charge, containers that:

1 ~~(1) Contain a substance which will render a drug chemically inert when
2 the drug is placed in such a container; and~~

3 ~~(2) Can be disposed of in the same manner as other solid waste without
4 polluting water or soil; and~~

5 ~~(b) Accepting unused drugs and disposing of those drugs in any lawful
6 manner;]~~

7 2. As used in this section, "retail community pharmacy" means a pharmacy
8 that is licensed by the Board and dispenses drugs directly to the general public at
9 retail prices. The term does not include:

10 (a) A pharmacy that dispenses prescription medications to patients solely
11 through the mail;

12 (b) A nonprofit pharmacy designated by the Board pursuant to NRS
13 639.2676;

14 (c) An institutional pharmacy;

15 (d) A pharmacy in a correctional institution; or

16 (e) A pharmacy owned or operated by a governmental entity.

17 Sec. 2. ~~This act becomes effective upon passage and approval for the
18 purpose of adopting regulations and performing any other preparatory
19 administrative tasks that are necessary to carry out the provisions of this act, and on
20 January 1, 2018, for all other purposes.] (Deleted by amendment.)~~
