

## SENATE BILL NO. 533—COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

MAY 5, 2017

Referred to Committee on Finance

**SUMMARY**—Makes appropriations to the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human Services for certain information system projects and authorizes the expenditure of certain money for such purposes. (BDR S-1198)

AN ACT making appropriations to the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human Services for certain information system projects; authorizing the expenditure of certain money by the Division for such purposes; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of \$127,500 for a master client index to develop a cross index of all databases of the Department.

2. Expenditure of \$1,147,500 not appropriated from the State General Fund or the State Highway Fund is hereby authorized during Fiscal Year 2017-2018 and Fiscal Year 2018-2019 by the Division for the same purpose as set forth in subsection 1.

**Sec. 2.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of \$1,000,000 for modernization of Access Nevada to provide clients



1 of the Division with the opportunity to submit electronic  
2 applications for Medicaid, the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance  
3 program and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families.

4 2. Expenditure of \$9,000,000 not appropriated from the State  
5 General Fund or the State Highway Fund is hereby authorized  
6 during Fiscal Year 2017-2018 and Fiscal Year 2018-2019 by the  
7 Division for the same purpose as set forth in subsection 1.

8 **Sec. 3.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State  
9 General Fund to the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of  
10 the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of \$407,673  
11 for a case management system to allow for the "no wrong door"  
12 approach to serving clients throughout the Department.

13 2. Expenditure of \$3,458,225 not appropriated from the State  
14 General Fund or the State Highway Fund is hereby authorized  
15 during Fiscal Year 2017-2018 and Fiscal Year 2018-2019 by the  
16 Division for the same purpose as set forth in subsection 1.

17 **Sec. 4.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State  
18 General Fund to the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of  
19 the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of  
20 \$9,304,699 for the second phase to modernize the automated  
21 processing system for the child support enforcement program.

22 2. Expenditure of \$20,120,886 not appropriated from the State  
23 General Fund or the State Highway Fund is hereby authorized  
24 during Fiscal Year 2017-2018 and Fiscal Year 2018-2019 by the  
25 Division for the same purpose as set forth in subsection 1.

26 **Sec. 5.** Any remaining balance of the appropriations made by  
27 sections 1 to 4, inclusive, of this act must not be committed for  
28 expenditure after June 30, 2019, by the entity to which the  
29 appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the  
30 appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and  
31 any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent  
32 for any purpose after September 20, 2019, by either the entity to  
33 which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the money  
34 was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the  
35 State General Fund on or before September 20, 2019.

36 **Sec. 6.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2017.
