

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3—  
SENATOR WOODHOUSE

MARCH 20, 2017

Referred to Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections

SUMMARY—Directs the Legislative Commission to conduct an interim study concerning a standardized system for the collection of information concerning the treatment of trauma. (BDR R-1142)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets ~~omitted material~~ is material to be omitted.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the Legislative Commission to appoint a committee to conduct an interim study concerning a standardized system for the collection of information concerning the treatment of trauma.

WHEREAS, Existing law requires the State Board of Health to adopt regulations which require each hospital to record and maintain information concerning the treatment of trauma in the hospital; and

WHEREAS, Existing regulations of the State Board require the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Health and Human Services to develop a standardized system for the collection of information concerning the treatment of trauma and to carry out a system for the management of that information; and

WHEREAS, Such an integrated state-wide system has not yet been fully developed or implemented; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE ASSEMBLY CONCURRING, That the Legislative Commission is hereby directed to appoint, as soon as practicable after July 1, 2017, a committee to conduct an interim study, as described herein, which is composed of:

1. Three members of the Senate, two of whom are appointed by the Majority Leader of the Senate and one of whom is appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate; and



2. Three members of the Assembly, two of whom are appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly and one of whom is appointed by the Minority Leader of the Assembly; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Legislative Commission shall designate one of the members appointed to the committee to serve as the Chair of the committee; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the committee shall conduct an interim study concerning a standardized system for the collection of information concerning the treatment of trauma, including, without limitation:

1. An examination of the actions that have been taken towards developing such a standardized system;

2. An analysis of the cost of developing and carrying out such a standardized system; and

3. Any other related information; and be it further

RESOLVED, That, in conducting the interim study, the committee shall consult with and solicit input from the Southern Nevada Health District, trauma service providers and the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Health and Human Services and others who have knowledge or may be affected by such a standardized system; and be it further

RESOLVED, That any recommended legislation proposed by the committee must be approved by a majority of the members of the Senate and a majority of the members of the Assembly appointed to the committee; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Legislative Commission shall submit a report of the results of the study and any recommendations for legislation to the 80th Session of the Nevada Legislature.
