SUMMARY—Urges Congress to enact federal legislation relating to national monuments. (BDR R-333)

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION—Urging Congress to enact federal legislation relating to national monuments.

WHEREAS, The Antiquities Act of 1906, 54 U.S.C. §§ 320301-320303, authorizes the President of the United States to declare by public proclamation as a national monument certain "historic landmarks, historic and prehistoric structures, and other objects of historic or scientific interest that are situated on land owned or controlled by the Federal Government"; and

WHEREAS, The Federal Government manages and controls over 85 percent of the land in Nevada; and

WHEREAS, Nevada has an abundance of natural resources, many of which are located on public lands managed and controlled by the Federal Government; and

WHEREAS, The Antiquities Act directs the President to confine the boundaries of the national monument to "the smallest area compatible with the proper care and management of the objects to be protected"; and

WHEREAS, In 2015, by presidential proclamation, President Barack Obama unilaterally designated 704,000 acres in the State of Nevada as the Basin and Range National Monument; and

WHEREAS, In 2016, by presidential proclamation, President Barack Obama unilaterally designated nearly 300,000 acres in the State of Nevada as the Gold Butte National Monument; and

WHEREAS, The designation of land as a national monument without input from the State regarding the possible detrimental effects on natural resource development, agriculture, tourism and other industries may create considerable hardship on regional, state and local economies; and

WHEREAS, The Nevada Legislature supports the direct involvement of the states in the establishment and expansion of national monuments under the Antiquities Act; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, JOINTLY, That the members of the 79th Session of the Nevada Legislature hereby urge Congress to enact legislation amending the Antiquities Act of 1906 to require the approval the Nevada Congressional Delegation prior to the designation of any future national monuments in the State of Nevada; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate prepare and transmit a copy of this resolution to the Vice President of the United States as the presiding officer of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and each member of the Nevada Congressional Delegation; and be it further
