Comment: This bill would require the State Plan for Temporary Assistance for Needy Families to authorize certain assistance to be provided to a person who provides certain care for a child to whom he or she is not related; expanding the rights of children placed in foster care; creating the Normalcy for Foster Youth Account in the State General Fund; authorizing money in the Account to be used to provide opportunities for children to participate in certain activities; providing civil and criminal immunity to a person with whom a child has been placed who acts in accordance with certain standards in approving or allowing the child to participate in certain activities; requiring the Division of Child and Welfare Services of the Department of Health and Human Services to hire a consultant to conduct a study of the child welfare system in this State.
