Although the State Board of Pharmacy and the Investigation Division work cooperatively to track and monitor prescription activity, the Investigation Division does not manage the computerized Prescription Monitoring Program as it pertains to the current data field capabilities. As such, the Investigation Division will defer to the State Board of Pharmacy regarding the current capabilities of the Prescription Monitoring Program and potential related fiscal impacts to the system. With regard to the remainder of the bill, the Investigation Division does not anticipate any fiscal impacts based on the current language of the bill.
