BDR 5-345 (SB472) sections 4-14 of this bill enact provisions governing the registration and community notification of juvenile sex offenders. Under section 10, the juvenile court is required to: (1) notify the Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History when a child is adjudicated delinquent for certain sexual offenses so that the Central Repository may carry out the provisions of law governing the registration of the child as a sex offender; and (2) inform the child and his or her parent or guardian that the child is subject to certain requirements for registration and community notification applicable to sex offenders. If this bill is enacted as introduced, the Nevada Department of Public Safety (DPS), General Services Division (GSD), Sex Offender Registry (SOR) would experience a gradual growth of juvenile registrations which may result in the need for additional staffing. At this time the projected number of initial juvenile registrants is less than 100 and expected to increase over time. Absent an actual caseload that would result from this requirement, a fiscal impact cannot be determined. GSD requests to return to the Nevada Legislature's Interim Finance Committee in the 2017-2019 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
