Bill Draft Request 14-1068 (BDR 14-1068) repeals the requirements of the Adam Wash Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006 that were codified into law per Assembly Bill 579 (A.B. 579) by the Nevada Legislature in 2017. BDR 14-1068 reinstates the provisions of Nevada law that existed prior to passage of A.B. 579, and reenacts provisions of State law governing the sex offender registration program and the duty of a sex offender or an offender convicted of a crime against a child to register with local law enforcement.

The Nevada Department of Corrections reviewed the provisions of this bill and concluded that there will be a fiscal impact to NDOC staffing and inmate populations as submitted in the SFY18/19 Governor's Recommended Budget. The increase in NDOC staffing is represented in the fiscal note as three Program Officer I positions, one at each of the intake locations (Northern Nevada Correctional Center, High Desert State Prison, and Florence McClure Correctional Center). Additional inmate populations are provided for in the Governor's Recommended budget as an average of \$18,719 in variable expenses per inmate for SFY18-19. The inmate driven fiscal impact of this proposal would be this amount for each year of a new prison sentence. Bill Draft Request 14-1068 (BDR 14-1068) repeals the requirements of the Adam Wash Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006 that were codified into law per Assembly Bill 579 (A.B. 579) by the Nevada Legislature in 2017. BDR 14-1068 reinstates the provisions of Nevada law that existed prior to passage of A.B. 579, and reenacts provisions of State law governing the sex offender registration program and the duty of a sex offender or an offender convicted of a crime against a child to register with local law enforcement. Violators will be guilty of category D or category C felonies and will not be granted probation or have their sentences suspended by a court.

The Nevada Department of Corrections reviewed the provisions of this bill and concluded that there would be a fiscal impact. It is known that the NDOC received 22 prison commitments between June of 2012 and March of 2017 for failure to register as a sex offender, failure to report a change of address, and for a second violation of failure to register as a sex offender. These figures translate into 4.6 offenders admitted per year sentenced to serve a minimum of 1 year to a maximum of 4 years, adding three inmates to the overall population and a flow of admissions and releases (see Exhibit 2). The Department will need three Program Officer I positions to work at the three intake centers (see Exhibits 3 and 4). These positions will combine the sex offenders caseload with the offenders convicted of committing a crime against a child caseload, will identify the individuals that need to be registered, and will prepare and process the forms. Existing staff will have to prepare lists of offenders that are due for release as of October 1st and identify the offenders that need to be informed of the new notification and registration requirements by incurring overtime. This legislation also proposes to reinstate the psychological evaluation panel and to gather information from State agencies regarding a sex offender's recidivism risk, requiring staff to interact with the psychological evaluation panel and become acquainted with a new assessment instrument that will be established to assign sex offenders to one of the three tiers of notification. The fiscal impact is determined to be three new positions and three more inmates per year.
