The Division of Public and Behavioral Health cannot determine the fiscal impact of BDR 14-1062.

Section 2.2 provides language relating to the requirements for a defendant to be eligible to complete a preprosecution diversion program. Section 2.5 does not require the court to place eligible defendants in a diversion program. Due to these limitations the Division cannot determine a probable caseload.

Section 3.3 requires the Department of Health and Human Services, if requested, to provide an assessment to determine if the defendant is addicted to alcohol or drugs. These assessments can be performed with current resources and authority.

Section 3.7 requires the defendant to pay the cost of any program of treatment to the extent of his or her financial resources. With this requirement and the increased availability of insurance, the costs to the Division will likely be minimal, regardless of caseload.
