This bill would allow the state to participate in the Emergency Service Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact and its associated Interstate Commission on EMS Personnel Practice. The Compact's purpose is to allow individuals with EMS licenses in one state to provide EMS services in any other state which is a member of the Compact. Basically, it's a reciprocal licensing agreement. This bill also would allow a similar reciprocal licensing arrangement for psychologists.

The Commission will be composed of one member from each participating state. The Commission will hire staff and its costs will be covered by an annual assessment from each member state, or fees imposed on other parties (See Section 10, part E). As the state of Nevada does not license EMS providers, County Health Department's do, it's possible (likely) that fees will be passed down to the County Health Departments and providers of EMS services (e.g. the Clark County Fire Department). The bill contains no limit on the amount of the fees charged. There are also concerns that special event (EDC, NASCAR, etc.) promoters will bring in out of state EMS providers to staff the events who maybe unfamiliar with the location of area hospitals, county protocols, etc.

The fiscal impact to Clark County cannot be determined at this time.
