Local Government Responses S.B. 327 / BDR 24 - 22

City/County: Carson City

Comment: Mandating voter registration to all residents who apply, or renew a Driver's License or ID at the Department of Motor Vehicles, may increase voter registration in Carson City by approximately 10,000 voters. This will increase the work load of the current staff; the City would require one additional full-time position to the Elections Division to handle the additional duties.

There would also be an increase in printing and postage costs; voter registration cards, correspondence, voter update cards, sample ballots and absentee ballots.

A revision to our voter registration software would be required. The amount listed below is based on 447 hours of work through our vendor.

With an increase in voters we would need to be prepared for a higher voter turnout. This would require an increase in voting equipment, additional voting locations and election workers.

Cost Breakdown:

Additional staff and office equipment: \$50,000, plus 1 x expense of \$3,000

Additional postage and printing: Per year \$2,000.

Voter registration software upgrades, improvements and compliance: 1x expense \$78,225 Voting equipment and additional election expense: 1 x expense of \$105,000. Expense per fiscal year \$9,200.

Comment: This bill will require the Department of Motor Vehicles to transmit electronically to the Secretary of State and the county clerks' voter registration information on all persons who submit an application for the issuance or renewal of or change of address for any type of driver's license or identification card issued by the Department. Only if the person affirmatively declines in writing, would this information not be required to be submitted. Programming costs for County Systems to receive this data would be a one-time cost. On an annual basis, Clark County will be required to send voter registration cards to voters, notices will be required to be sent to new voters who refuse to provide party information at the DMV, and there will be an increase in the number of sample ballot costs to the County for new voters signed up in this way.
