Comment: If it becomes easier for charter schools to multiply, and they continue to be funded based on the unique expense characteristics of the student's resident county public school district rather than the expense characteristics of the charter school (which may not have much for overhead, utilities, transportation, etc., yet the NDE Equity Allocation Model which determines the final distribution per pupil amounts to districts assumes these costs for ALL SCHOOLS), it will create more charter schools that are overfunded, which by definition means dollars taken away from the public school districts. As written, this bill requires that all charter schools be given the same exemptions as public schools (i.e. property taxes and business license fees exemptions). Currently, public schools are responsible for providing certain services, including security and police services, even though they are exempt from paying property taxes and business license fees. As written, this bill would exempt charter schools from having to pay those taxes and fees, but would still potentially require the City to provide police and other services to charter schools without them having to pay for those services, which creates a negative fiscal impact on the City.
