Issues regarding employee organizations are restricted (for now) to employee organizations who have at least 1,000 so, there would be no fiscal impact to Churchill County, unless this changes.

Comment: This bill requires the employer to provide in-person orientation to the employee at their work location within 30 days after the employee's date of hire. This bill also requires union notification of new members within 7 days after the employee's hire date. This bill becomes effective July 1, 2017.

If this bill passes, at least six additional positions are required to provide orientation for all 37 departments at the employee's worksite during the employee's work shift. This fiscal impact would be greatly reduced if Sec 2 (2) removes "at the work location" and become no fiscal impact if "during regular work hours of the employee" were removed. All employees would be paid and efficiency gained if new hires would be allowed to come to one place to receive their orientation. In many instances under this bill, four or five employees would have to travel to orient one new employee.

Cost of additional staff (5 positions Schedule 28/29 and one position of Schedule 26) include salary and benefits.
