The state or local government is responsible for all costs associated with participation in this system.

This bill requires EITS establish system reporting specifications and requirements for the statewide nonemergency system. Until the Department of Motor Vehicles is able to analyze these requirements, the fiscal impact is undeterminable. The proposed implementation date of this bill is 07/01/2017.
