Fiscal Note for Mesquite City Charter

BDR S-434, SB 56

The proposed charter closely mirrors the current day-to-day operations of the City of Mesquite; therefore, there are not any major fiscal impacts for implementation. That said, there will be some minor positive fiscal impacts as a result of gained operational efficiencies.

Going forward, there are two areas of potential fiscal impact; however, the amount of those impacts is undeterminable at this time. First, the City seeks to establish a public trust for the furtherance of any authorized or proper function of the City. Second, the City seeks to amend the applicable debt limit definition. The proposed definition includes more items, than the definition found in NRS 266. As a result, the City will have a more conservative debt limit, than currently.

Any other fiscal impacts to the City as a result of the Charter are fiscal impacts that the City is already experiencing through existing State law.
