Please note...Section 17 of this bill states that the Secretary of State shall "prescribe methods of voter education intended to inform voters that the designation of a political preference on a ballot for the primary or general election does not imply that the candidate has been nominated or endorsed by that political party or that the party approves of or affiliates with that candidate." To the extend that "prescribe methods of voter education" simply means authorizing allowable vote education methods or directing local election officials on what methods of voter education they should use, this bill has no fiscal impact on the Secretary of State's office. However, if "prescribe methods of voter education" means actually implementing and carrying out various methods of voter education, this bill would have a substantial fiscal impact on the Secretary of State's office. This fiscal note assumes the former (not the latter) interpretation of "prescribe methods of voter education."
