The Nevada Department of Corrections has reviewed the proposed provisions of BDR 43-598 revising specific statutes under Chapter 484 C that will mandate, unless exempt due to a medical condition, that the level of concentration of marijuana or marijuana metabolite in an individual's system be measured in nanograms per milliliter of blood instead of urine to determine if the individual who is operating a motor vehicle or a water vessel is under the influence. It is possible that the proposed method might affect the precision of the tests results. However, DUI offenses are often punishable with fines or jail time unless they result in bodily harm or death to a victim and there should be no impact on the number of cases that result in prison incarceration, and BDR 43-598 should have no immediate impact on the size of the prison population. The NDOC has determined the changes in this bill will have no fiscal impact to the Department.
