BDR 15-891 section 1 provides that a person who knowingly solicits a child who is less than 14 years of age for prostitution shall be punished for sex trafficking. Section 2 defines the crime of human trafficking. Section 4 revises the definition of "victim" to include a person who is a victim of human trafficking, thus authorizing the person to assert the privilege of confidential communication between the person and a victim's advocate. Enactment of this bill as introduced would require staff of the General Services Division (GSD) to modify 1 Nevada Offense Code (NOCs). The impact cannot be determined until GSD calculates the cumulative total of all legislation from the 2017 session. GSD requests to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2017-2019 biennium should the cumulative workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
