Also, the bill is not clear who would pay for the publication costs, but filing and other fees are waived for TPO's, so the court could also be burdened with the publication costs. There is no way to determine how many cases would fall in to the scenario authorizing publication.

Comment: Bill could require the Sheriff's Office to post EPO information in a newspaper for 4 weeks. To post a multiple-page (EPO) ad in the Reno Gazette Journal for 4 weeks = \$2167  
WCSO has roughly 100 unserved orders per year that would require posting in a local newspaper for four weeks. Besides the privacy concerns and liability of posting a person's information there will be additional staff hours required to comply with posting 100 orders per year but these factors cannot be calculated at this time. Known potential fiscal impact: 100 Unserved protection orders times cost to post in a local paper 100x\$2167 = \$216,000 annually \$216,000
