Comment: Carson High School currently offers AP Computer Science, but with this bill, we may need to reduce a math position to offer more classes in computer science as I would guess many kids would be interested in taking this in lieu of a math credit. The problem there is computer science teachers are even harder to find than math teachers. I consider the cost at CHS a wash for purposes here. However, our alternative high school (Pioneer HS) does not offer computer science currently. Securing a teacher there would be the \$100,000 annual cost. It potentially could be reduced if it could be offered as an online class.

Comment: CCSD has an existing course that could meet the computer science requirements. This would primarily involve training and support for secondary teachers to teach the course and for the instruction that is also required in elementary schools on basic computer skills for testing. The estimated cost for this program would be \$93,160.

Secondary- 2-day summer training for Computers teachers: 2 days x 8 hours x 80 teachers x \$22/hr = \$28,160

Secondary- Substitutes to support 4 days of ongoing training & professional development for Computers teachers throughout the year: 80 teachers x 4 days x \$100/day/sub = \$32,000

Elementary- one 3-hour training with sample lesson plans and materials for two teachers per school = 3 hours x 500 teachers x \$22/hr = \$33,000
