Currently the Names on the person(s) ID is used on the marriage license and certificate. In order comply with the changes, initially the Clerks off would have to work with their existing systems vendor and find out if the system could support the additional name fields. The estimate for system enhancement to accommodate the change is \$100k, it is unknown if they could meet the July 1, 2017 implementation date. Additionally in order to maintain the same standard of service the clerks office estimates that the additional requirements would take 2-5 minutes per customer and based on current volume of marriage certificates/license they anticipate the need for 2 additional office specialist (Salary/Benefits \$56,486 per position).
