BDR 40-17 Redo 1 Section 16 addresses provisions for administering a controlled substance that is designed to end the life of a patient. Section 23 prevents a person from withholding health care due to the patient's request or refusal for a controlled substance that is designed to end the life of a patient. Section 24 adds a new category A felony for a person who alters or forges a request for a controlled substance that is designed to end the life of a patient, or coerces or exerts undue influence on a person who requests or refrains from taking or self-administers a controlled substance that is designed to end the life of a patient. Enactment of this bill as introduced would require staff of the General Services Division (GSD) to create 19 new sub-types and create 19 new Nevada Offense Codes (NOCs). The impact cannot be determined until GSD calculates the cumulative total of all legislation from the 2017 session. GSD requests to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2017-2019 biennium should the cumulative workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
