BDR 16-546 requires the Director of the Department of Corrections (DOC) verify the full legal name and age of an offender in order to provide a photo identification card. This bill adds county, city, town, and juvenile detention facilities to allow them to issue a prisoner identification card in the same manner as the DOC identification card.

This BDR allows for the one time waiver of fees for a duplicate license to released persons from county, city, town and juvenile detention facilities in the same manner in which is currently in place for Department of Correction's released offenders. The DMV understands it may potentially have a revenue loss with the addition of these individuals. However, the DMV is unable to determine exactly what that revenue loss might be. The DMV has exhausted all avenues to obtain the annual release statistics for inmates and has been unsuccessful in obtaining that number in order to accurately depict the potential revenue loss.

There will be minor policy changes and training needed to include the new prisoner identification card details. The card production fee that is paid to the vendor will be subsidized by the DMV.
