This BDR is vague in its requirements for POST. Most of the section 1 is already contained in established performance objectives. Section 2, the commission may provide simulators for tactical training. There are 10,432 active peace officers in Nevada and they belong to 137 different agencies. The use of force/decision making simulators that we currently use cost \$20,000. Given the number of agencies and officers that potentially would use them a minimum of four would be needed. A training specialist would need to be added to POST (\$94,216 pay and benefits) to manage the systems and be trained by the simulator company for \$5000 and to fulfill the requirements of section 3. The training specialist would also develop curriculum for incumbent officers and serve as the investigator in 2, C. The added training specialist will also serve as the liaison between POST and local agencies to ensure the most effective use of resources, section 4. In-state travel would be increased for audits and training adding \$3600, out-of-state travel to attend professional conferences and to stay current with best practices would increase by \$3000. Travel is estimated using current levels of funding.
