## **Explanation**

The Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC) has reviewed BDR 14-559, S.B. 378 relating to the governmental administration of marijuana. This bill makes various changes to the NRS by making allowances to the holder of a valid registry identification card to engage in the medical use of marijuana and not have the use affect the user's ability to hold a permit to carry a concealed firearm; requiring the sealing of all records relating to certain convictions concerning the possession of a controlled substance; authorizing the holder of a valid registry identification card to engage in the medical use of marijuana while completing treatment for the abuse of alcohol or drugs; providing that the odor of marijuana upon certain persons does not alone constitute probable cause to search the person or the person's property to inspection; revising provisions relating to prohibited acts by a person while driving or being in actual physical control of a vehicle or commercial motor vehicle on a highway or on premises to which the public has access or while operating or being in actual physical control of a vessel under power or sail on the waters of this State; providing for the testing of the saliva of the holder of a valid registry identification card to determine the presence of marijuana therein under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto. Sections 24 and 33 remove marijuana and marijuana metabolite from the list of controlled substances that are prohibited beyond a given level of concentration in the urine or blood. Instead, the maximums allowable levels of concentration for marijuana delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol and marijuana metabolite (11-OH-tetrahydrocannabinol) are provided in blood nano grams per millimeter. It has been determined that there is no additional fiscal impact to the Department of Corrections.
