BDR 15-965 (SB360) section 3 of this bill increases the maximum term of the imprisonment for the commission of abuse of an older or vulnerable person from 6 years to 20 years. It also revises the penalties for offenses relating to the neglect or exploitation of an older or vulnerable person and provides that the commission of a second or subsequent offense is punishable as a category B felony. Enactment of this bill as introduced would require staff of the General Services Division (GSD) to create 19 new sub-types, create 19 new, and repeal 15 Nevada Offense Codes (NOCs). The impact cannot be determined until GSD calculates the cumulative total of all legislation from the 2017 session. GSD requests to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2017-2019 biennium should the cumulative workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
