## Presidential Preference Primary Election Elko County Clerk Cost Estimate

The following is an estimate for potential costs related to a Presidential Preference Primary Election, which would be considered a full-blown election. It is the assumption that voter registrations will increase, as will those casting votes if legislation is passed for this bill. Costs from the 2016 Primary Election were used to make an educated guess as follows:

Costs currently paid for by the Secretary of State's office for programming by the vendor would still be paid for by them. It is assumed that the previous voting locations would be available at no cost as in previous elections.

It is also my understanding that Elko County would be reimbursed for all costs of such an election from the Reserve for Statutory Contingency Account.
