Comment: If BDR 24-851 were to pass, there would be fiscal impacts to Churchill County. Legislation that seeks to expand the number of polling places (establishing a polling place within the boundaries of an Indian reservation), requires the addition of languages (such as Mandarin and Cantonese) to voting materials, requires rosters to be in electronic form, and increases the time polls are open, will all require additional staff and volunteer hours. The additional staff time and the impacts created by the other mandates listed above will all create significant fiscal impacts to Churchill County, however the magnitude of these impacts is difficult to determine at this time.

Comment: Section 2 of this bill will allow the County Clerk to establish polling places where any registered voter can vote in person the day of the election. Sections 6 and 31 require the Clerk to establish at least one polling place per Indian Reservation or Indian Colony. Section 9 of this Bill requires the County to provide voting materials in Mandarin and Cantonese. Section 16 of this bill extends early voting for two additional days.

Creating a polling place in Indian Reservation will create additional costs, as additional Poll Workers will be needed. There are numerous costs associated with voting materials being provided in Mandarin and Cantonese. Two additional days of early voting support will have a fiscal impact. Costs will occur every two years during County elections.

There is a requirement for additional staff to cover the polling place where any person entitled to vote may appear and to cover two additional polling places within the boundaries of Indian colonies for both early and regular voting. There are also increased ballot costs to meet the new language requirements. In addition, the County will be required to have electronic signatures which will require new equipment. Finally, there is the requirement for additional advertising. These changes will result in a large additional expense to the County - a realistic estimate is not available at this time.
