The Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC) has reviewed BDR 3-839, S.B. 387 which makes proposed revisions to various NRS related to protective orders. Section 18 of this bill amends NRS 193.166 by adding an emergency, ex parte or extended order for protection against a high-risk offender issued pursuant to section 8 of this act be a sentence enhancement of 1 to 20 years if the offender is also guilty of a category A or B felony. For other category felonies the enhancement will be 1 to 5 years. The NDOC cannot determine the impact of Section 18 because this is a new type of order for Nevada law. The NDOC has five inmates now serving time for violation of an extended order of protection. Based on current language of the proposed statute change, the NDOC is unable to forecast the increase, if any, in the number of offenders admitted to the NDOC system at this time. The Governor's Recommended budget provides an average of \$18,719 in variable expenses per inmate for SFY18-19. The fiscal impact of this proposal would be this amount for each year of a new prison sentence. The fiscal impact of this proposed law cannot be quantified at this time.
