Assembly Bill No. 303—AN ACT relating to corrections; requiring core correctional services to be provided only by the State or a local government; repealing provisions relating to the operation of private facilities and institutions that house prisoners; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblywoman Monroe-Moreno moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Corrections, Parole, and Probation.
