INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

By the Committee on Judiciary:

Senate Bill No. 277—AN ACT relating to criminal justice information; creating the Subcommittee on Criminal Justice Information Sharing of the Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice; revising provisions governing the release of certain information relating to the medical use of marijuana; repealing provisions governing the Advisory Committee on Nevada Criminal Justice Information Sharing; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Segerblom moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Motion carried.

By Senator Harris:

Senate Bill No. 278—AN ACT relating to crimes; creating the Account for Restitution to Certain Older Victims of Crime; revising provisions relating to certain crimes committed against an older person or a vulnerable person; increasing the penalty for certain crimes against an older or vulnerable person; authorizing coroners and their deputies to access criminal history records; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Harris moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary. Motion carried.

By Senator Settelmeyer:

Senate Bill No. 279—AN ACT relating to marriage; authorizing a mayor to perform a marriage under certain circumstances; prohibiting a mayor from accepting any fee or anything of value for performing a marriage, except for nonmonetary gifts of nominal value; revising various provisions governing the performance of marriages; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Settelmeyer moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Motion carried.

By the Committee on Judiciary:

Senate Bill No. 280—AN ACT relating to criminal procedure; authorizing district courts to assume original jurisdiction of certain cases involving

veterans and members of the military; providing exceptions to certain prohibitions on the dismissal of, probation for and suspension of sentences in certain cases involving veterans and members of the military who are charged with battery constituting domestic violence or driving under the influence of alcohol or prohibited substances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Segerblom moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Motion carried.

By Senator Manendo (by request):

Senate Bill No. 281—AN ACT relating to taxation; revising provisions relating to the reconveyance or sale of real property by a county treasurer for delinquent taxes; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Manendo moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Revenue and Economic Development.

By Senator Segerblom:

Senate Bill No. 282—AN ACT relating to peace officers; prohibiting a law enforcement agency from performing certain actions relating to an investigation of a peace officer; requiring the dismissal of certain actions against a peace officer and the imposition of certain other sanctions against the State or a local government under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Segerblom moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Government Affairs.

Senate Bill No. 283—AN ACT relating to special license plates; providing for the issuance of special license plates indicating support for the Vegas Golden Knights hockey team; exempting the special license plates from certain provisions otherwise applicable to special license plates; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senate Bill No. 285—AN ACT relating to real estate; revising provisions governing the period after initial licensure within which a real estate broker, real estate broker-salesperson or real estate salesperson is required to complete certain postlicensing education; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Atkinson moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce, Labor and Energy.

Senate Bill No. 286—AN ACT relating to applied behavior analysis; transferring the responsibility for the regulation of applied behavior analysis from the Board of Psychological Examiners to the Aging and Disability Services Division of the Department of Health and Human Services; revising the composition of the Board; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Gansert moved that Senate Standing Rule No. 40 be suspended and that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce, Labor and Energy.

By Senators Gansert, Roberson, Cannizzaro, Parks, Cancela, Ford, Goicoechea, Gustavson, Hammond, Hardy, Ratti, Settelmeyer; Assemblywomen Benitez-Thompson and Tolles:

Senate Bill No. 287—AN ACT relating to protection of children; requiring an agency which provides child welfare services to notify certain entities of a substantiated report relating to the abuse or neglect of a child committed by a school employee or volunteer in certain circumstances; requiring the principal or other administrator of a public school or private school to carry out certain recommendations relating to the protection of a child; requiring school employees and volunteers to report the abuse or neglect of a child by any person; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Gansert moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services.

Motion carried.

By Senators Parks, Segerblom, Manendo, Woodhouse, Cannizzaro, Cancela; Assemblymen Tolles, Araujo, Hambrick and Swank:

Senate Bill No. 288—AN ACT relating to citations; deleting provisions which prohibit the issuance of a citation to a driver or passenger in a vehicle

for a violation of the requirement to wear safety belts under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Parks moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Transportation.

Motion carried.

By Senator Hardy:

Senate Bill No. 289—AN ACT relating to health insurance; requiring insurers who issue certain policies of health insurance which provide coverage using a network plan to provide for the reimbursement of services provided by an out-of-network physician; requiring a physician who receives such a reimbursement to accept the reimbursement as payment in full; requiring such a policy of health insurance to include provisions relating to recovery of a copayment, deductible or coinsurance from an insured for such a reimbursement; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Hardy moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce, Labor and Energy.

Motion carried.

By Senator Hardy:

Senate Bill No. 290—AN ACT relating to genetic counseling; prohibiting certain persons from representing themselves as licensed or certified genetic counselors; authorizing the imposition of professional discipline against certain persons who violate that prohibition; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Hardy moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce, Labor and Energy.

Motion carried.

By Senators Hardy, Harris, Atkinson, Gansert, Parks and Settelmeyer:

Senate Bill No. 291—AN ACT relating to health care records; requiring a custodian of health care records to perform certain duties; limiting fees that may be charged for a digital copy of certain health care records; revising the civil and criminal penalties for a custodian who violates certain requirements; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Hardy moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce, Labor and Energy.

Motion carried.

By Senator Hardy:

Senate Bill No. 292—AN ACT relating to physicians; exempting physicians and osteopathic physicians who hold a valid and unrestricted license to practice in another jurisdiction from provisions governing the practice of medicine or osteopathic medicine for certain purposes relating to athletics; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Hardy moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce, Labor and Energy.
