

**MINUTES OF THE  
SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY**

**Seventy-ninth Session  
May 19, 2017**

The Senate Committee on Judiciary was called to order by Chair Tick Segerblom at 1:51 p.m. on Friday, May 19, 2017, in Room 2134 of the Legislative Building, Carson City, Nevada. The meeting was videoconferenced to Room 4412E of the Grant Sawyer State Office Building, 555 East Washington Avenue, Las Vegas, Nevada. [Exhibit A](#) is the Agenda. CHAIR SEGERBLOM:

We will open the work session on Assembly Bill (A.B.) 25.

**ASSEMBLY BILL 25**: Revises provisions relating to certain allowable deductions from the period of probation or sentence of a person. (BDR 14-171)

PATRICK GUINAN (Policy Analyst):

For everyone's information, Senate Bill 474 is not going to be considered today.

**SENATE BILL 474**: Repeals provisions governing sex offenders which were originally enacted for purposes of the federal Adam Walsh Act. (BDR 14-1068)

The work session document ([Exhibit C](#)) summarizes A.B. 25, which defines what it means for a probationer to be current with any fee and payment of restitution and clarifies the requirements that a probationer must satisfy to be allowed a deduction from his or her period of probation. Chairman Segerblom has brought two separate amendments forward. The first one we discussed a few days ago.

CHAIR SEGERBLOM:  
I am going to pull those amendments.

MR. GUINAN:  
In that case, there are no amendments to the bill.

SENATOR FORD MOVED TO DO PASS A.B. 25.

SENATOR DENIS SECONDED THE MOTION.

THE MOTION CARRIED. (SENATORS GUSTAVSON, HARRIS AND ROBERSON VOTED NO.)

CHAIR SEGERBLOM:  
With the rest of the bills other than A.B. 380, I think we have an agreement.

**ASSEMBLY BILL 380 (1st Reprint)**: Revises provisions relating to real property.  
(BDR 10-340)

MR. GUINAN:  
We have several that are Do Pass bills, and then we have several that are Amend and Do Pass bills. Therefore, we could do the Do Pass bills first.

CHAIR SEGERBLOM:  
Let us do the Do Pass bills.

SENATOR CANNIZZARO:  
Yesterday, we had A.B. 376 on the calendar, and there was a new amendment. Just prior to this hearing, I was discussing that amendment with both the proponents of the amendment and other stakeholders. There are still some

conversations to be had on this. I will be a yes today, but I want to note for the record that we are still in the middle of a conversation.

**ASSEMBLY BILL 376 (1st Reprint)**: Revises provisions relating to criminal procedure. (BDR 14-1075)

CHAIR SEGERBLOM:

After we do the Do Pass bills, we will do the Amend and Do Pass bills.

MR. GUINAN:

The work session document ([Exhibit D](#)) summarizes A.B. 204 which allows an applicant for a marriage license and certificate to select the name that he or she would like to be known by once married. There are no amendments proposed for this bill.

**ASSEMBLY BILL 204 (1st Reprint)**: Provides that marriage licenses and certificates of marriage may include the name to be used by each spouse after the marriage. (BDR 11-743)

The work session document ([Exhibit E](#)) summarizes A.B. 251 which authorizes the State Board of Pardons Commissioners to commute a sentence of death or life without the possibility of parole to a sentence that would allow parole if a person is convicted of any crime that the person committed when he or she was less than 18 years of age. There are no amendments proposed for this bill.

**ASSEMBLY BILL 251**: Authorizes the State Board of Pardons Commissioners to commute certain sentences of juvenile offenders. (BDR 16-304)

The work session document ([Exhibit F](#)) summarizes A.B. 260, which authorizes a justice of the peace or municipal judge to suspend the sentence of a person who is convicted of a misdemeanor constituting solicitation for prostitution on the condition that the person participates in a treatment program and complies with any other conditions ordered by the court. There are no amendments proposed for this bill.

**ASSEMBLY BILL 260 (1st Reprint)**: Revises provisions relating to the crime of prostitution. (BDR 1-821)

SENATOR DENIS MOVED TO DO PASS A.B. 204, A.B. 251 AND A.B. 260

SENATOR CANNIZZARO SECONDED THE MOTION.

THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

MR. GUINAN:

The rest of the bills on the work session today are Amend and Do Pass bills. I am going to run down the list of what they are, and I have one bit of explanation to make on the last one.

The work session document ([Exhibit G](#)) summarizes A.B. 123, which revises provisions governing the creation of a series by a limited-liability company. There are two amendments.

**ASSEMBLY BILL 123 (1st Reprint)**: Revises provisions governing a series created by a limited-liability company. (BDR 7-531)

The work session document ([Exhibit H](#)) summarizes A.B. 219, which revises the boundaries of a gaming enterprise district known as the Las Vegas Boulevard gaming corridor to remove the Beverly Green residential neighborhood. Proposed Amendment 4836 is attached.

**ASSEMBLY BILL 219**: Revises provisions relating to gaming enterprise districts. (BDR 41-193)

The work session document ([Exhibit I](#)) summarizes A.B. 286 which authorizes justice and municipal courts to establish programs for the treatment of veterans and members of the military who are charged with first misdemeanor offenses of battery constituting domestic violence or driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs. We have proposed changes from Senator Cannizzaro.

**ASSEMBLY BILL 286 (2nd Reprint)**: Revises provisions relating to court programs for the treatment of veterans and members of the military. (BDR 14-872)

The work session document ([Exhibit J](#)) summarizes A.B. 288 which provides that immunity from civil or criminal liability for certain acts does not extend to a person who abused, neglected, exploited, isolated or abandoned an older or vulnerable person who is the subject of a report or investigation or any person who committed certain other acts relating to the abuse, neglect, exploitation, isolation or abandonment of an older or vulnerable person. We have two proposed amendments.

**ASSEMBLY BILL 288**: Revises provisions relating to the protection of older persons and vulnerable persons. (BDR 15-724)

The work session document ([Exhibit K](#)) summarizes A.B. 376, which requires a complaint to be filed within 72 hours after a person is arrested without a warrant. There is one proposed amendment.

The work session document ([Exhibit L](#)) summarizes A.B. 377, which prohibits a prosecuting attorney from seeking an indictment of a defendant for any offense while competency proceedings are pending except upon application to the chief judge of the district court and with leave of the court. There is a conceptual amendment.

**ASSEMBLY BILL 377 (1st Reprint)**: Revises provisions relating to the competency of a defendant in a criminal case. (BDR 14-1074)

The work session document ([Exhibit M](#)) summarizes A.B. 380, which allows an owner of real property to record a notice in the office of any county recorder, providing that any use of the owner's real property is with the permission of and subject to the control of the owner.

**ASSEMBLY BILL 380 (1st Reprint)**: Revises provisions relating to real property. (BDR 10-340)

On A.B. 380, one of the amendments the Chair would like to put up for consideration of the members today is to have members' names added to the bill as sponsors. Anyone who would like to have his or her name added as a sponsor as part of this amendment, please let me know and I will add your name as a sponsor and that would be a part of the Amend and Do Pass motion.

SENATOR FORD SECONDED THE MOTION.
