AN ACT relating to state emblems; designating neon as the official
state element of the State of Nevada; and providing other
matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law designates various symbols of the State of Nevada, including a
2 state metal, a state precious gemstone and a state semiprecious gemstone. (NRS
3 235.090, 235.100, 235.110) This bill designates neon as the official state element of
4 the State of Nevada.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 235 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 *The chemical element known as neon is hereby designated as*
4 *the official state element of the State of Nevada.*

5 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2019.
