SUMMARY—Requires the creation of a passport program for historical sites. (BDR 33-505)

AN ACT relating to historic preservation; requiring the Office of Historic Preservation of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to create a passport program to issue stamps in a booklet for participants that visit certain historical sites; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law creates the Office of Historic Preservation of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources which prepares and maintains the State Register of Historic Places. (NRS 383.021, 383.085) This bill requires the Office to create a program through regulation that will issue stamps in a program booklet or passport to participants that visit certain sites, structures, objects and districts on the State Register.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 383 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

The Administrator shall, by regulation, establish a historic sites passport program that issues stamps in a program booklet or

passport to program participants that visit sites, buildings,
structures, objects or districts placed on the State Register of
Historic Places pursuant to NRS 383.085.
Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2019.
